Anne Morton Smith joined Rogerson Communities in 1999 as Assistant Director of Development. She was promoted to Director of Communications in 2003, to Director of Development and Community Relations in 2004, and, most recently, to Vice President of Development and Community Relations in 2008. She created and managed Rogerson's signature event, *Welcome Home!*, a successful gala that has helped to place Rogerson in the public eye. Before coming to Rogerson, she worked at the Dimock Community Health Center where she orchestrated a 3,000 guest action, directed the annual fund, managed foundation relations, and was a successful grant writer. For the Foundation for Children with AIDS she managed a multitude of special events, wrote and edited foundation collateral and coordinated grant proposals.

A graduate of Amherst College with a double major in literature and fine arts, Ms. Smith lends her creative talents to all that she does for Rogerson Communities. An enthusiastic volunteer, she is an active member of Women in Development of Greater Boston and serves on the Board of Directors for Egleston Square Main Street.
